Euphorbia pulcherrima

aka

Poinsettia

You've received an irresistible potted poinsettia as a gift. How do you keep it beautiful through the holidays?

To help yours stay pretty, try this:

1. Place your poinsettia in indirect light daily (fluorescent light will work).
2. Keep it away from cold windows and warm or cold drafts.
3. Poinsettias do best at temperatures of 65 to 70 degrees.
4. Check the soil daily. Water the plant when the soil is dry. Wilted plants will tend to drop bracts sooner.
5. Don't fertilize poinsettias while in bloom.

Contrary to popular belief, poinsettias are not poisonous to either humans or pets.

Want a rebloom next year?

If you manage to keep your potted poinsettia alive until next fall, you can trick it into bloom by placing a lightproof bag over the plant or putting it in a closet. Poinsettias need at least 14 hours of complete darkness each night for six to 10 weeks to trigger bloom. Remember to start in early October so you can have blooms in time for Christmas.

Remember to enjoy each day, for it's a blessing.

Thanks for all the help closing the sporting clays range. The snow came early and made a mess however, everything is cleaned, serviced, and stored ready for next spring.

Well the winter is here; we will keep trap and skeet ranges open if the weather allows. After that we will keep the road plowed and shoot off the porch with the wobble-trap.

Tip # 9; Use low recoil target loads for practice. Shotshells containing 7/8-1oz shot are adequate for practice. The lessened amount of shot with more powder gives these shells high velocity, low recoil, and excellent pattern integrity. Many tournament shooters prefer these light loads even under tough tournament shooting conditions.
