Follow Up

Last year we thought it best to review our range safety procedures and maybe institute a few new ones. You'll remember there was a list of eight suggestions and/or concerns that we needed to address.

1. If you see something that seems unsafe it is your duty to shout CEASE FIRE. **Done**
2. Leave your firearms in the rack until your squad is called to the firing line. **Done**
3. DO NOT interrupt anyone who is on the firing line. **Done**
4. We maintain a list of members, and guests' waivers to be checked when signing in. **Deemed unnecessary**
5. Guests must be thoroughly briefed by an RSO about our club's safety rules & use of their firearm prior to filing waiver. **Pending**
6. Members must accompany their guests whenever the guest is on any range. **Done**
7. Install a membership card activated entrance gate. **Deemed unnecessary**
8. Hold safety meetings periodically with RSO. **Pending**

In order to handle the two pending suggestions we'll probably need to appoint a training officer.

Pistol Range

If you have been out to the pistol range, you will see the progress we've made towards "semi-indoor shooting". We have enclosed the pavilion leaving the wall facing our target berm open.



The next step is to paint the building, then we will construct a gate between the block retaining wall and the pistol building and install fencing behind our pistol storage shed limiting entrance to the range to going thru the building.

This summer, if we get enough donations, we hope to install lighting, interior walls and shooting benches. We are estimating the cost is between \$4000 and \$6000.

This work has been financed entirely thru CPL fees and donations made specifically to the pistol range.

Here's a practice to develop your one hand shooting skills I found in Shooting Illustrated. This training exercise originally came from a Recon Marine Instructor.

Starting at 3 yards with the pistol in your normal strong-side shooting hand point and fire two rounds, transfer the pistol to the support hand and fire two rounds, transferring the pistol from hand to hand after every two rounds. Shoot until the pistol is empty. Check your target, reload, step back a bit and repeat. Keep repeating this sequence until you see your accuracy is falling off with either hand.

How fast should you shoot? As quickly as you can make the hits. Remember, don't focus on the target while shooting, focus on the front sight.

I tried this a few days ago. Once I became used to using the only front sight for reference, I began to keep all my shots on a piece of typing paper.
