#### **Indoor Ranges**

We are working on the plans and cost estimates to create an indoor air gun and archery range in our large storage building.

To build these ranges, we will need to finish, or build out, eighty (80) feet towards the rear of the building.

To complete the first phase of this project, the ceiling, we will need to hire someone to install attic vent chutes, OSB and eventually insulation. Vent chutes protect the insulation from condensate dripping off the metal roofing.

The cost for this would be \$1,000 for vents, \$2,000 for OSB, and \$4,500 for labor. Totaling \$7,500. We wouldn't insulate until we were finished with the walls, windows, electrical, and heating.

To do the entire ceiling at this time would cost another \$3,500 for a total of \$11,000.

To invest \$11,000 at this time merely for a couple of low use ranges doesn't make much sense. However, we would have the beginning of a new clubhouse, which, if you remember, was the original plan for this building.

If we approve this project, we would complete this phase this winter.
