## **Archery**

I hope everyone has been able to get out and enjoy the warm weather we have been having. I myself have been out and found a few deer sheds along with doing some very early pre-season scouting for the upcoming 2024 deer season. As we close in on spring, I'm eager to get the course set back up for you all. By the time you read the next newsletter, I'll have a set date as to when the course will be back open for you to enjoy. I'm still open to suggestions, so if you think of something you would like to see or ideas that may make our course more enjoyable, please don't hesitate to reach out.

We will start installing the ceiling vents in our big storage building soon. The crew that's doing the work has a few jobs to finish before they start work on this project. If I was forty years younger, I'd start the job myself, but I am not, so we'll have to wait. We think that part of the ceiling work will take a week once we begin. The board has authorized \$5,000 for this portion of the project. After completing the insulation vents, we plan to install a ceiling, that is if we get the funding.

When the ceiling is completed, we will need to install an overhead heater and some lights. This will allow us to use the building for our new air rifle and archery competitions starting next fall.

If all goes well and we can put together the funds, we'll continue working on the project until we have a 40ft by 80ft room that can be used for many club functions in addition to a shooting range.

We are going to start a policy of closing the ranges  $2\frac{1}{2}$  hours after we open. If you want to shoot some other time you will need to contact me and make arrangements prior. Remember we are a club of volunteers, please clean up after yourselves, your mother is not here and there is not a maid service. There are magnets in the club house for those that shoot pumps & semis pick up and throw away your hulls.
